Sermon Series: The Big Picture Sermon title: The Magnificence of Jesus Christ Scripture Reading: John 1:43-51 Clearwater Bay International Baptist Church April 14, 2019 S.C. Brown, Pastor

The first and foremost value of our church is **Beholding** God. We want to be people who see God, but not just see. We want to delight in Christ. We want to feel joy in Christ. We want to feel a passion burning in our hearts for Christ; to love him, to adore him, to yearn to know him.

I have one simple task today; I want to exalt Jesus Christ in our hearts and minds. I want to elevate him as high as I possibly can. I want to brag on Christ! I want to declare to you his matchless worth, his majesty and his magnificence. I want to show you that he is the fulfillment of the Old Testament promises.

Now today, we finally come to The Man, Jesus Christ. How can I plumb the depths of who he is? How can I accurately describe this man? Can words convey his brilliance or the glory that is due him? I will surely fall short. So, brothers and sisters read the Bible! Mine for rubies and gold in the deep caverns and **BEHOLD** his glory in the scriptures.

In our study of the major themes of the Bible, we've been going through the Old Testament for many weeks. We've been working a puzzle. We've been putting many pieces together and trying to make out what the meaning of the whole Bible is.

Today we come to the New Testament and the puzzle will become clear. In fact, my hope and prayer is that today it'll be more clear than you've ever seen it in your life.

Turn to John chapter 1.

This is the place that I have chosen to go to extract the riches of Christ in the New Testament after spending many weeks in the Old Testament.

I'm going to start further back in chapter 1 and then go back to the beginning.

[Read John 1:43-51]

Jesus is the fulfillment of the Old Testament scriptures.

"We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth" There are other places where Jesus himself declared that he was the fulfillment of the scriptures; that he is the one they've been waiting for.

[Read John 5:39] [Read Luke 24:25-27] [Read Luke 24:44-45]

We started out our first week by looking at **Creation**and what we found is that Jesus Christ, God the Son was there in the beginning.

Next we looked at man's **Fall** into sin. There we saw the first promise of a deliverer who will crush the serpent's head. Jesus Christ crushed Satan when he died and rose again.

We looked at the **Promise** made to Abraham and the other patriarchs. The promise is that an offspring of Abraham that will bless all nations. God is saving people from all nations through Jesus Christ.

We saw in the **Exodus**, that He's the passover lamb that is slain to deliver from death.

In the **Conquest & Settlement**, He's the new Joshua that conquers all our enemies and provides a land for us to live in forever.

When we studied **Kingship**, we saw that He's the better King that we all need in the line of David; the

promised King who will reign on the throne for eternity.

In the **Exile**, we saw that He's the holy and righteous judge who disciplines those he loves and will not tolerate idolatry.

And last week we studied the **Return & Restoration.** We saw Jesus Christ as the forgiver of sin and the one who restores us to God. He's the mediator of a better covenant.

But, he's **much more** than just a fulfillment of Old Testament scriptures! Let's look at who Jesus Christ is in John 1 and marvel. [Read John 1:1-3]

So, you should hear echoes in this text of Genesis chapter 1. "In the beginning". Creation. Life. Light. Darkness. **Jesus Christ is God**. He is God! The one we have been waiting for is not *merely* a human, not just a King, not just a deliverer, not just a restorer...but he is God.

He's "with God" and "in the beginning with God" but yet he is God. So, he's not the Father God yet he is still God. Look at verse 3. It says, "All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made." Verse 10 repeats this, "the world was made through him". He's the **Creator**. I don't know any other way to say it but to say that when you read Genesis 1 you should think of the preincarnate Jesus Christ.

So, when it came time for God to send this promised deliverer we've been waiting for, what we find is that he's not only the promised deliverer but he is divine. We didn't expect him to be God!

John 1 is filled with the divinity of Jesus. In verse 4 where it mentions that *"in him was life"* and that he is *"the light"* this is accentuating what John has already said about him being God and Creator.

Let's scan through John 1 and behold who he is!

- [Verse 12] He who gives the right to become children of God. (Isaiah 8:18)
- [Verse 14] He who tabernacled among us. (Ezekiel 37:27-28)
- [Verse 14] He who has the glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. (Exodus 33:18)
- [Verse 15] He who ranks before John (cuz he was before John).
- [Verse 29] He who is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. (Genesis 22)

- [Verse 32] He on whom the Spirit descends and remains. (Isaiah 11, Isaiah 42)
- [Verse 41] Messiah. (1 Samuel 16)
- [Verse 45] He of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote. (Deuteronomy 18)
- [Verse 49] He who is the true Rabbi. (Isaiah 54:13)
- [Verse 49] He who is the Son of God. (2 Samuel 7)
- [Verse 49] He who is King of Israel. (2 Samuel 7)
- [Verse 51] Him on whom the angels ascend and descend. (Genesis 28)
- [Verse 51] He who is Son of Man. (Daniel 7:9-14)

Which title did Jesus call himself the most?

Son of Man. [Read Daniel 7:9-14]

Oh, how magnificent and glorious is this man Jesus Christ! Listen to just some of the things that he is known as.
